GYM SUIT WASHING INSTRUCTIONS

"Machine wash with warm water on gentle cycle. Wash inside out. Do not use hot water. Do not use bleach. Hang dry. Do not wash with other items such as denim or warm-ups. These instructions are important for a longer life of your garment. Hot water and bleach can cause the material to "bleed." A hot dryer can damage the printing on the garment." Gym suits are available for sale throughout the entire school year.

NO EATING IN THE HALLWAYS OR AT LOCKERS PLEASE!

Students are not allowed to eat or drink in the hallways or at their lockers. Please help us be sure that your child eats breakfast at home before school starts so that they do not find themselves nibbling at their lockers between classes. Lincoln has several students who suffer with severe allergies and this rule is in place to ensure the safety of all. We sincerely appreciate your consideration and cooperation. If a parent feels their child needs special consideration regarding this rule, please contact Mrs. Smith, RN, Lincoln school nurse.

- Label your child's jacket, calculator, lunch bag and just about everything else!
- Missing something? Come by to check the Student Lost and Found!
- Students go outside for lunch recess every day if weather permits. Please be sure to send your child with a sweatshirt or jacket as fall weather approaches. It's a good idea to simply keep a hoodie in your locker!
- Students who ride bikes to school should be sure to use a sturdy lock. Skateboards can also be locked on the skateboard rack in the front of the school by Door #1.
- Check the Lincoln website . . . We try to keep families informed of all sorts of information via our website . . . Check your email . . . Lincoln communicates with families using email all the time! BUT—don't hesitate to call the school office if you have a question!

Important Traffic and Parking Reminders

In order to create a safe environment for our students, we must all cooperate and comply with the traffic restrictions around the school. The following points should clarify these expectations:

- ◆ Slow Down! The school zone speed limit is 20MPH. Remember: **NO CELL PHONE USE while behind the wheel!**
- ◆ Be Patient! We recognize that it takes time to drop off/pick up students before and after school and we are all very busy.
- ◆ Stay to the right when dropping off/picking up your child in the front drive. The left lane is for passing only.
- ◆ Pull as far forward as possible in the front drive to allow for others to fill in behind you.
- ◆ Students should exit vehicles only on the north sidewalk of the front drive. They should not exit vehicles and cross in front of other vehicles.
- ◆ Parking is prohibited in the drive and on the north side of Lincoln Street in front of school.

Also, be sure to take note:

- ◆ Candota Parking lot drop off is permitted.
- ◆ **NO AUTO TRAFFIC IN THE BACK LOT.**




ACTIVITY BUS ROUTE MAP

How does the activity bus work?

The activity bus is available to those students who are paid bus riders with bus passes. The activity bus route runs Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays and leaves at 3:55pm. Students board the bus in the back lot by the Busse Gym. Depending on the amount of stops the route must make, the route may take an hour to complete. Please see the route map below!

Please review the map below with your child and determine which stop you feel would be the closest to your home. Your child should know their stop number and let the bus driver know where they intend to get off the bus. Please call the office if you have any questions.

Lincoln Middle School PTO of Mount Prospect Committees

Cultural Arts plans assemblies and programs for the students which complement the school curriculum.

Dynamite Night is an annual fall event of games, prizes, food, music and dancing. Sixth graders attend in the late afternoon and seventh/eighth graders in the evening. This committee hires the game vendor and DJ, purchases food and schedules volunteers. This is the biggest social event sponsored by the Lincoln PTO.

Graduation Activities are end of year events for the eighth graders that include a dance, picnic, baby picture contest, and production of a DVD. It's a great way to send off our eighth graders and provide wonderful memories to take with them to high school.

Hospitality / Helping Hands provides refreshments at events, as well as helping Lincoln families who face hardship by providing meals and other welcome needs.

Membership promotes and coordinates the Lincoln PTO membership drive. Volunteers are needed early in the school year to staff tables at back to school events and promote involvement.

Grade level activities are held for sixth and seventh grade students. This committee plans the events, orders food (if needed), secures raffle prizes and schedules volunteers.

Staff Appreciation plans activities to recognize Lincoln's staff. This includes providing meals during conferences and during staff appreciation week in May. The committee determines theme, events and coordinates activities and volunteers.

Winter Activities plans for various ski/sledding trips at local facilities during the winter months. The committee collects registration forms, money, secures transportation and orders snacks. (And snow!)

Library Assistance helps checking books in and out, puts books on hold, locates reference, non-fiction, fiction and magazines, ensures magazines are in alphabetical order and takes inventory of books used for research.

Kindergarten Art Adventure (5-6 years)


