Is there an APPEARANCE CLAUSE?



A Message from Your Superintendent

Good morning, District 57 families. I have a quick report from last night's School Board meeting:

Adam Parisi presented the **tentative budget for 2018-2019**. The Board will approve the final budget in September. As you know, we are beginning to receive needed funding from the successful referendum, and we're happy to report that we're now able to project a balanced budget with a surplus of approximately \$3 million. One of our top priorities is addressing deferred maintenance and overcrowding issues in the buildings. This could potentially include adding space at Fairview, which is at capacity. This is just one of the many projects identified and communicated during the referendum campaign and currently under consideration. We're working to develop a prioritized list of recommended projects for the summer of 2019, using the Master Facility Plan as our guide. We'll present that list to the Board in October, and we'll share it with you at that time as well.

You'll also have an opportunity to learn more about this when the School Board hosts its **first Community Forum of the year** on Thursday, October 11 (7 p.m., Westbrook). Board members will explain how funds from the referendum will be applied to deferred maintenance and other priorities, and they'll ask for your input. I hope you can be part of the discussion.

Last night we also talked about establishing Board guidelines regarding **class sizes and sectioning**. This discussion was the result of the recent decision to add a fifth-grade section at Lions Park and extra support in Fairview fifth grade. We reiterated the need to balance student needs with the District's financial constraints, and also the importance of maintaining parity between Fairview and Lions Park. After some discussion, Board president Joe Sonnefeldt requested that the Board's policy committee draft some grade-specific criteria that we in Administration can refer to when making difficult decisions about how many students to place in each class. This will help us explain to community members how and why decisions are made and the many factors that must be considered. We will further communicate the Board's criteria when they're available. Stay tuned!



Dear Parents :

In the unfortunate event that an emergency or crisis situation occurs in our area during the school day, we want you to know that Lincoln Middle School is prepared. With the help of the Mount Prospect Fire and Police Departments, we have designed a Standardized School Crisis Plan that will assist us in effectively responding to these types of situations.

While your natural instinct as a parent in an emergency is to go to your child's school to safeguard him/her, please understand that doing so may significantly impede our response capabilities as well as those of our local emergency responders. It is vital that school officials and the Police and Fire Departments have access to our buildings to manage the situation and give care to students. In addition, it may be necessary to evacuate students to another location if there is immediate danger.

In an emergency or crisis situation, we need your cooperation and assistance and ask that you please follow the guidelines below:

- In the event of a crisis that requires an evacuation/relocation of students, contact (847) 394-7300 for information. In all other emergency situations, contact (847) 394-7350.
- Tune to major local television and radio stations for information on the situation and instructions on how to reunite with your child. In some emergency or crisis situations, it may be necessary to relocate to another facility for safety reasons.
 Your designated reunification site is St. Raymond Catholic Church located at 301 S. I-Oka Avenue.
- When you travel to the reunification site, please be sure to bring picture identification. We will only release students to their legal guardians, or the authorized individuals as listed on your child's emergency forms.

Enclosed you will find quick reference wallet cards with the above information for your use. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter. Our ultimate goal is to keep your children safe while they are under our care.




ACTIVITY BUS ROUTE MAP

How does the activity bus work?

The activity bus is available to those students who are paid bus riders with bus passes. The activity bus route runs Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays and leaves at 3:55pm. Students board the bus in the back lot by the Busse Gym. Depending on the amount of stops the route must make, the route may take an hour to complete. Please see the route map below!

Lincoln Middle School PTO of Mount Prospect Committees

<u>Cultural Arts</u> plans assemblies and programs for the students which complement the school curriculum.

Dynamite Night is an annual fall event of games, prizes, food, music and dancing. Sixth graders attend in the late afternoon and seventh/eighth graders in the evening. This committee hires the game vendor and DJ, purchases food and schedules volunteers. This is the biggest social event sponsored by the Lincoln PTO.

<u>Graduation Activities</u> are end of year events for the eighth graders that include a dance, picnic, baby picture contest, and production of a DVD. It's a great way to send off our eighth graders and provide wonderful memories to take with them to high school.

<u>Hospitality / Helping Hands</u> provides refreshments at events, as well as helping Lincoln families who face hardship by providing meals and other welcome needs.

<u>Membership</u> promotes and coordinates the Lincoln PTO membership drive. Volunteers are needed early in the school year to staff tables at back to school events and promote involvement.

<u>Grade level activities</u> are held for sixth and seventh grade students. This committee plans the events, orders food (if needed), secures raffle prizes and schedules volunteers.

<u>Staff Appreciation</u> plans activities to recognize Lincoln's staff. This includes providing meals during conferences and during staff appreciation week in May. The committee determines theme, events and coordinates activities and volunteers.

<u>Winter Activities</u> plans for various ski/sledding trips at local facilities during the winter months. The committee collects registration forms, money, secures transportation and orders snacks. (And snow!)

Library Assistance helps checking books in and out, puts books on hold, locates reference, non-fiction, fiction and magazines, ensures magazines are in alphabetical order and takes inventory of books used for research.
