Question:

Can I just drop off some Tylenol/allergy medicine for my child?



Answer: No.

Medications (over-the-counter or prescription) are dispensed as follows:

- (1) If appropriate paperwork is on file in the health office, an administrator or the school nurse can administer the medication to your child.
- (2) If a parent wants to bring medication to school on an as-needed basis, the parent must wait in the office to actually administer the medication to the child. Parents may not drop off medications for students to take independently. Do not send medications in backpacks or lunch boxes.

HOMEWORK EXPRESS

- Available Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday from 2:55-3:45 pm.
- A smaller setting that provides a place for instructional support and homework completion. This is an academic intervention. Data is recorded and teams review student progress weekly.
- ONLY STUDENTS WHO ARE ASSIGNED BY THEIR TEAM TO HOMEWORK EX-PRESS MAY ATTEND.
- Supervision provided.
- Students are expected to arrive no later than 2:55pm and stay until 3:40pm.
- Supervisors take attendance and log student activities each day.
- Activity bus available at 3:50pm for registered riders.

Family Tips from Common Sense Media: Strategic Searching



When teens want to know something, they usually "google it" by typing a question or search term into a

search engine. Teens need to acquire skills to get the best and most relevant information in their searches.

<u>Common Sense Media</u> provides the following tips:

- Go beyond Google.
- Use multiple, specific, descriptive keywords.
- Try synonyms.
- Use quotation marks.
- Use a minus sign before a word to show you don't want it included.
- Pay attention to URL domains.
- Recommend trusted sites to search for specific issues.

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Lincoln Middle School PTO of Mount Prospect Committees

<u>Cultural Arts</u> plans assemblies and programs for the students which complement the school curriculum.

Dynamite Night is an annual fall event of games, prizes, food, music and dancing. Sixth graders attend in the late afternoon and seventh/eighth graders in the evening. This committee hires the game vendor and DJ, purchases food and schedules volunteers. This is the biggest social event sponsored by the Lincoln PTO.

<u>Eighth Grade Activities</u> are end of year events for the eighth graders that include a dance, picnic, baby picture contest, and production of a video. It's a great way to send off our eighth graders and provide wonderful memories to take with them to high school.

<u>Grade level activities</u> are held for sixth (typically considered to be Dynamite Night) and seventh grade students. This committee plans the events, orders food (if needed), secures raffle prizes and schedules volunteers.

<u>Staff Appreciation</u> plans activities to recognize Lincoln's staff. This includes providing meals during conferences and during staff appreciation week in May. The committee determines theme, events and coordinates activities and volunteers.

<u>Winter Activities</u> plans for a ski/sledding trip at a local facility during the winter months. The committee collects registration forms, money, secures transportation and orders snacks. (And snow!)
