Dear Fairview Families,

Happy New Year! I hope this message finds you rested and ready for the new calendar year after enjoying time with family this holiday season. We are excited to be back in action after the winter break and have already had an action-packed two weeks of January.

Today officially marks the halfway point of our school year. Teachers have been learning more about our new curricular materials in both reading and math for almost twenty weeks. Our new math program, Math in Focus, has created quite a shift in how we are instructing our students. I've heard many comments from parents that the new methods of teaching math have been a bit confusing at times. In light of these comments, I thought I'd share an article I came across during the fall that gives some rationale as to why we are teaching math the way we are using our new program. While this article isn't specifically about Math in Focus, the ideas presented follow a similar philosophy. By taking about 5 minutes to read through the article, I believe parents will gain a deeper appreciation for some of the new methods being utilized in our classrooms. Last Friday, students had the opportunity to show us their current reading fluency rate through participating in our Winter Benchmarking Day. Homeroom teachers brought their classes to the LRC where students sat with a staff member and read three separate passages for one minute each. Their benchmarking score that we recorded was the median number of words per minute that they read out of the three passages. Along with our reading fluency benchmarking, students also took the M-CAP (math concepts and applications) screener during their first week back from winter break. This assessment is an 8-minute timed test that assesses students' abilities to apply the concepts they are learning in math class. Throughout the entire month of January, students' reading comprehension is also analyzed using the Fountas & Pinnell reading assessment. This assessment helps generate a reading level for each child and helps teachers direct further instruction. All school-wide data will be analyzed later this month during our data day where teams of teachers gather together to look at the data and determine if students need further reading or math intervention beyond their typical classroom instruction. If you have any questions about this process, please feel free to contact your child's classroom teacher.

Over this past week, several students took part in our Fairview Follies auditions. Many of our students will be selected to perform in the annual Fairview Follies show on Thursday, January 29th from 6:00 – 8:00 p.m. We hope to see you there! As we head into next week, please note that there is no school on Monday to celebrate the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Tuesday is a non-attendance day for students, as teachers will be participating in professional development during our district-wide institute day. We look forward to seeing students again on Wednesday, January 21st. I hope you have a wonderful weekend!

Book It! Reading Incentive Program

All Fairview students are invited to read, fill in the reading log, and earn a free personal pan pizza coupon from Pizza Hut, if you reach or exceed the January reading goal of 360 minutes.

Your name will also go up on your grade's Book It! poster in the LRC when you turn in your first completed reading log. Read all six months and you may win a special prize.

Q - How do I participate?

A - Each day you read at home, fill in this reading log by recording the minutes you spend reading. Count up the total number of minutes you read during the month, fill in your first and last name, your grade and teacher's name. Then, have an adult sign to verify the log and return it to school.

Q - Do I have to wait until the end of the month to turn in my log?

A - No, you can turn in your log as soon as you reach or exceed the monthly goal. Turn in your log by the date indicated on the calendar or sooner.

Q - Do I have to read and fill in minutes every day?

A - No, you do not have to read every day. You will be able to exceed this month's goal by reading 20 minutes a day five times each week.

Q - Some days my teacher gives me a homework assignment to read 15 or more minutes at night. Can I count that reading time when I fill in the Book It! reading log?

A - Yes, you can count that time if you are reading outside of school hours. Any reading done at home counts.

Q - I like to read comic books and graphic novels, or nonfiction books. Does that count? A - Yes, you can count the time you read books, magazines, newspapers, or comic books. Any kind of reading counts.



Kindergarten Enrollment

District 57 will be utilizing an enrollment and registration process for kindergarten for the 2015-2016 school year. There will be three components to this process: an online portion beginning on January 5th, enrollment at Westbrook School beginning January 20 and an online registration in Spring. In order to enroll in kindergarten, children must be five years old by September 1, 2015. All District 57 kindergarten students attend Westbrook School, 103 South Busse Road.

January Enrollment

Online Pre-Enrollment Intake

Beginning on January 5th, 2015, our Online Intake will be accessible to parents on our District and Westbrook websites to submit basic information and download forms of interest. This required, online component allows for a more efficient experience during our in-person enrollment portion.

In-Person Enrollment

For the second portion of this process, parents will need to come to Westbrook School on January 20, 2015 between 9:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. During this time, parents will be required to bring in your child's original birth certificate and proof of residency: state-issued picture ID, two different current utility bills for two consecutive recent months and either a copy of a lease, monthly mortgage statement or current tax bill. Incoming students need not be present.

Spring Registration

Parents who have completed the enrollment process in January and proven residency will be allowed to take part in the district online registration scheduled for Spring. This step will give kindergarten parents a chance to review and update information collected in January, as well as pay necessary fees. Additional information about May Registration will be sent out at a later date.

Circle of Friends Registration 2015/16

Our Circle of Friends Pre-School Program is beginning registration for the 2015/16 school year. This program provides a naturalistic early childhood environment that is rich in language and literacy experiences and recognizes children as active learners. Our program combines children with and without special needs in a developmentally appropriate pre-school class.

Registration for the 2015/16 Circle of Friends Preschool Program lottery will be on Tuesday, February 3 through Thursday, February 5, at the Westbrook School office from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. Students currently enrolled in the program will be guaranteed enrollment for next year. Our AM and PM sessions will include children ages 3 to 5 (multi-age/multi-ability). Every consideration will be given to AM/PM requests.

Spots are limited and students will be enrolled using a lottery system. Only residents of District 57 will be accepted into the program. On February 9 and 10, 2015, parents will receive a phone call confirming or denying acceptance into the program. If denied, parents may choose to have their child put on a waiting list. Written verification will follow. An application is complete only when a completed application form, a completed Home Language Survey, an original birth certificate (will copy and return original), and a registration fee of \$100 are all received in our office. We also need to verify residency with the following documents:


