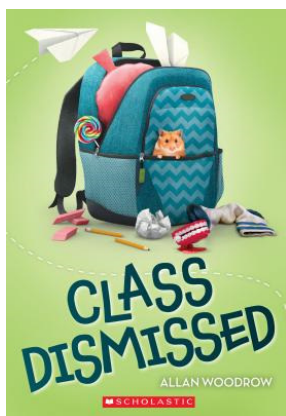
### *The Curse of the Werepenguin*, (Hardcover) ~~\$17.99~~ \$14.39

But Baron Chordata appears to be a twelve-year-old boy who wears tuxedos all the time, shouts at everyone, and forbids Bolt from asking questions. Things couldn't get any worse . . . until midnight, when the Baron bites Bolt and turns him into a half boy, half penguin. Then things really couldn't get worse-- nope, wait, they get a lot worse. With the help and hindrance of a plucky girl who just might be the world's greatest bandit, a whale cult led by a man whose weapon is a stale loaf of French bread, and a sinister but friendly fortune-teller who can't stop cackling, Bolt's on a quest to reverse the curse, return to human form, and stop the Baron from taking over the country of Brugaria with his army of mind-controlled penguins.



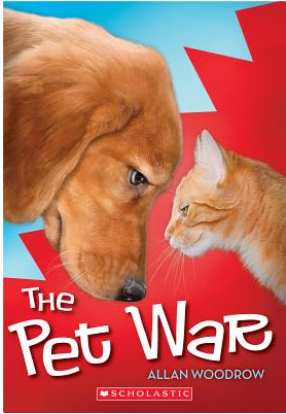
### *Unschool'd*, (Paperback) ~~\$7.99~~ \$6.39

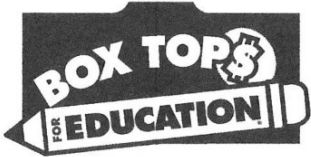
Fairview Elementary School is partnering with Cradles to Crayons to collect new and gently used essential children's items.

February 3 – 28, 2020

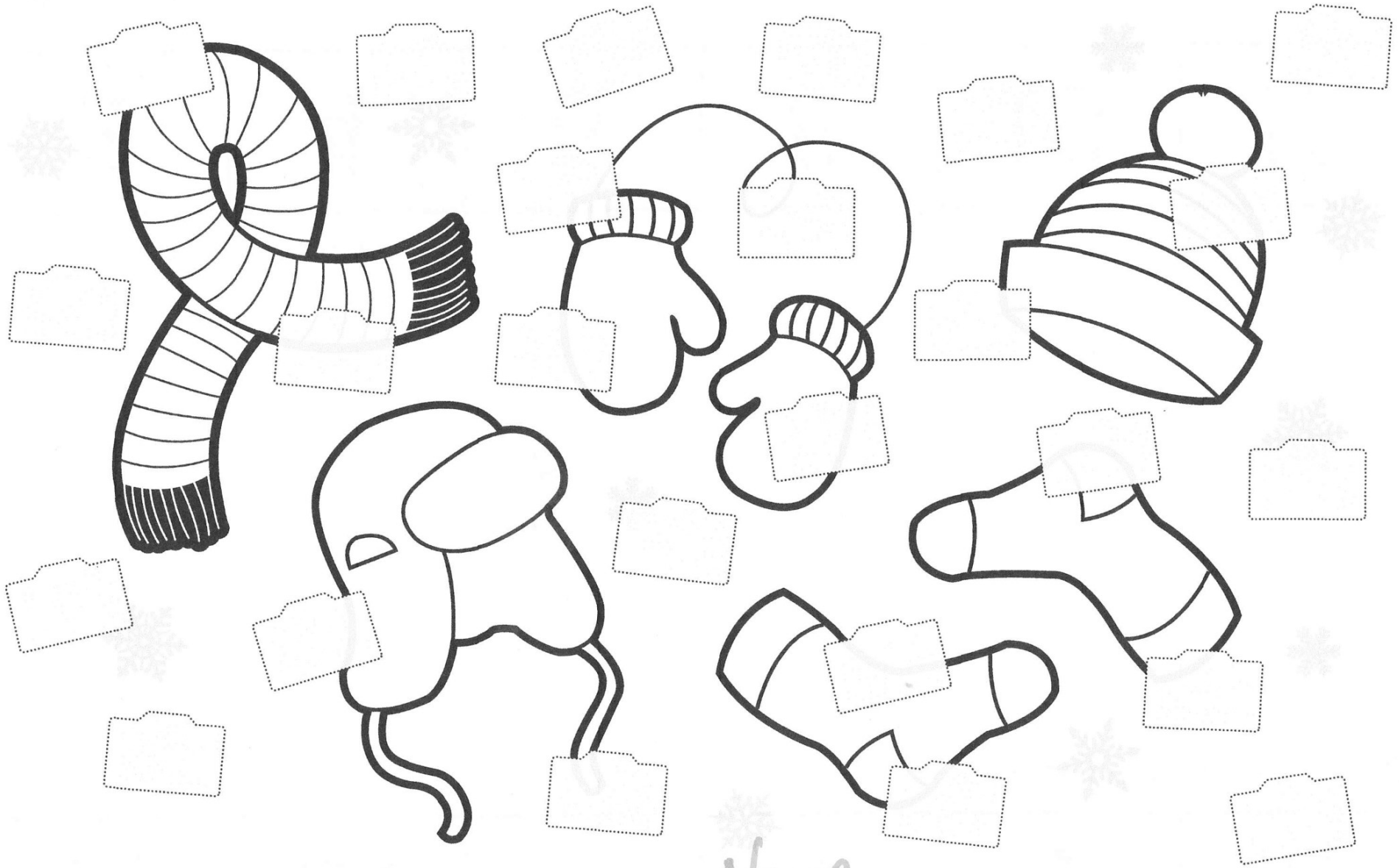


Please pick up a collection tag at the Fairview Office (300 N Fairview Avenue, Mount Prospect) and turn in donations by February 28<sup>th</sup>.
