Dear Fairview Families.

On Thursday, October 31st, we will be enjoying Halloween festivities as a school community. We will hold our annual Halloween parade starting at 1:30 p.m. Students will walk around the outside of the school where parents are welcome to stand by and watch all of our students show off their costumes. Then our PTO room parents will be hosting Halloween parties in each of our classrooms for students to enjoy. Room parents likely have already contacted parents to help as volunteers, but if you are unsure if you are scheduled to volunteer, you can contact them directly. In terms of our procedures for Halloween, many parents choose to take their child home during the lunch hour to change into their costume. This is not required, as children can change into costumes in the bathroom after the lunch hour; however, if you would like to take your child home during the lunch hour, please follow these procedures.

- On Monday, October 28th, we will send an email with a link for you to notify us if you plan to take your child home during the lunch hour. Please be sure to fill out this form when you receive the link.
- Come to the Fairview office no earlier than 11:40 a.m. You do not need to sign your child out, as the form you fill out serves as a sign out form. We will queue you in line in the hallway outside the gym as you arrive.
- Children who are going home during the lunch hour will be sent down to the gym to be picked up at 11:40 a.m.
- Once students are settled in the gym, we will direct them to look for the person picking them up as we slowly let parents and guardians into the gym. When you connect with the child or children you are picking up, you will exit out the west gym doors and then out of the building through the exit on the west side of the building near the baseball fields.
- Upon return to Fairview, all students need to sign back in. There will be tables set-up in the fover and staff members ready to check them in. Parents are not required to walk in with their child. It is fine to drop them off and have them walk in on their own as we will be ready to greet them and direct them at the sign in tables.

Today, students will be bringing home their score reports from the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) test they took in late August. In addition, students in fourth and fifth grade will also be bringing home their Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) score reports based on last spring's assessments. Please contact your child's teacher if you have questions about either report. As a school, we utilize our MAP data to determine the overall success of our programs, make decisions on how to best tailor our instruction for individual students, and look at student growth over their years at Fairview. We utilize our IAR data more globally as a school and as grade level teams to help us determine areas of focus to help better prepare our students for success.

The PTO has been actively supporting our school and students in a variety of ways during the month of October. As a school staff, we truly appreciate the planning that went into events such as our first special lunch and the PTO Boo Bash, which is sure to be a big hit next Friday, October 25th from 5:30-7:30 p.m. We are so fortunate to have such an invested group of parents serving Fairview to create enjoyable experiences for our students.

IInstructions

It's important to stay aware of how our on-screen and offscreen activities fit into our lives. Do a media balance checkup on your family. Get one or more family members together to help. Read the setup before doing the activity together!

ಆಳಿ Setup

Read aloud: We balance the food we eat to stay healthy. We also need to balance our media use. Media includes the shows and videos we watch, the video games and apps we play, and the music we listen to. Let's answer questions to see if our media use is balanced. Then we can decide if we want to make some changes.

(<) Activity

Read aloud: Let's answer these questions together.

- Do digital devices (phones, tablets, TV) ever keep us from getting enough sleep?
- Do we use them while we eat?
- Do we do activities together without devices?
- Do we ever use them together?
- Does our digital device use ever cause fights? If so, what are the fights about?
- When we use our devices, how is it fun? What do we learn?
- Is there anything we want to change about how we use our devices? If so, what?

Does the way your family uses media feel balanced and healthy? Give a thumbs up or thumbs down. Does your family agree? If you want to make changes, what are they? Think of changes that work for the whole family since you're all on the same team!
