Instead of asking parents to sell raffle tickets, collect donations, or sell products, we are asking you to make a donation to join the PTO. **If every family can donate \$25, \$50 or \$100** we can fully fund the PTO budget without spending money on raffle prizes, giving a percentage to a sales company, or using our volunteers' time coordinating a separate event. 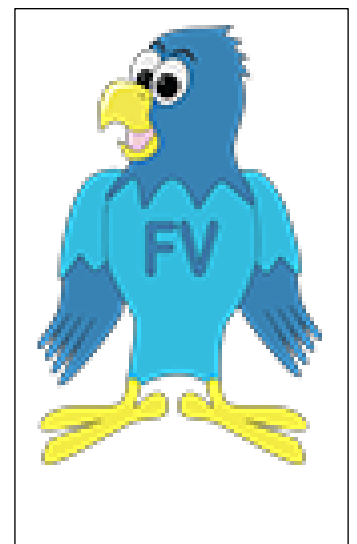


HALLOWEEN CANDY DRIVE!

Over the years, the Foundation has funded \$1.5 million in grants used for items such as, computers, iPads, ELMO projectors, Smartboards, musical instruments, art supplies, fitness equipment, flexible classroom seating and supplemental reading material - all to enrich our children's educational experiences. 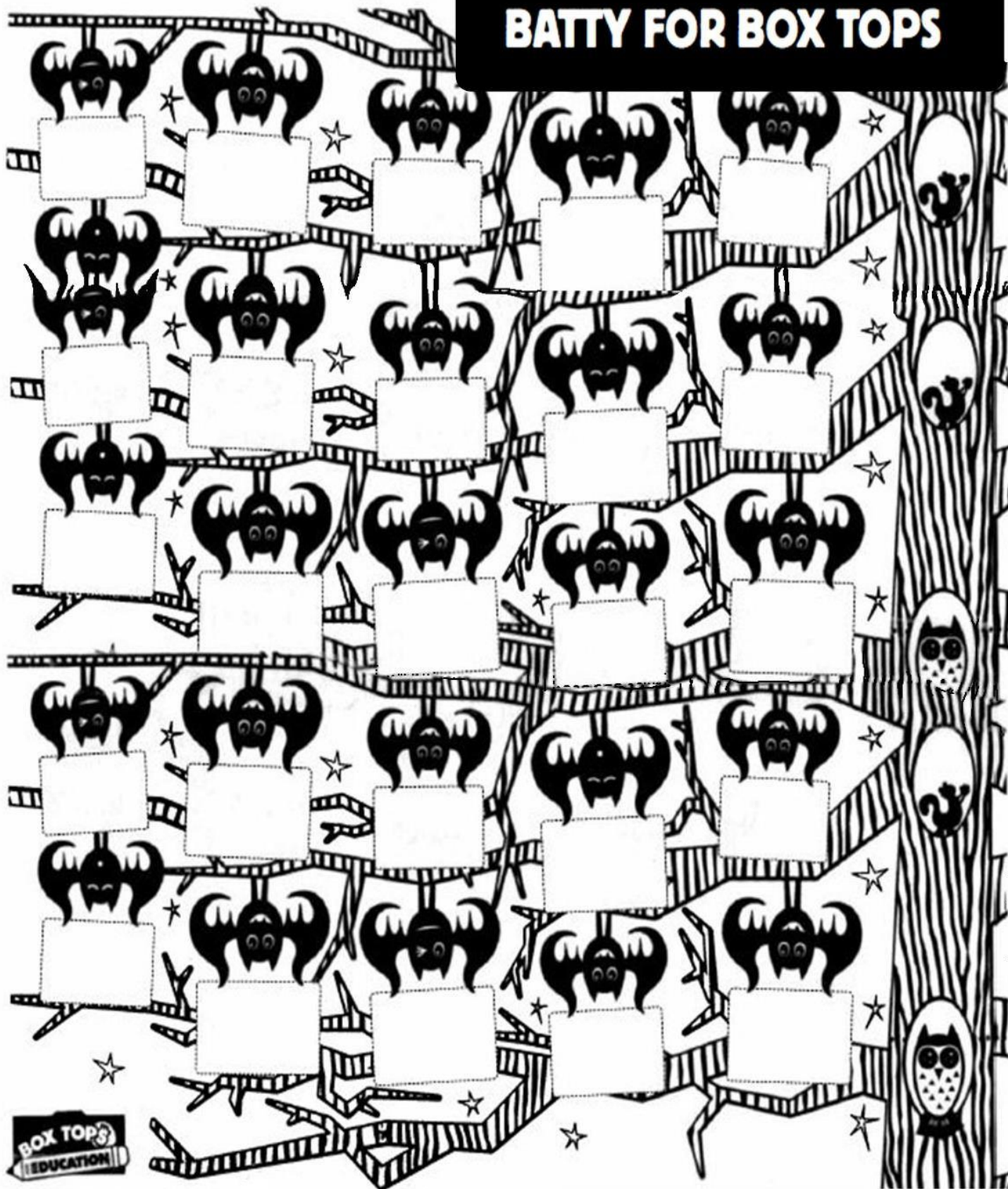

MEDIA BALANCE & WELL-BEING

We find balance
in our digital lives.

Digital citizenship: Thinking critically and using technology responsibly to learn, create, and participate

Instructions

It's important to stay aware of how our on-screen and offscreen activities fit into our lives. Do a media balance checkup on your family. Get one or more family members together to help. Read the setup before doing the activity together!

Setup

Read aloud: We balance the food we eat to stay healthy. We also need to balance our media use. Media includes the shows and videos we watch, the video games and apps we play, and the music we listen to. Let's answer questions to see if our media use is balanced. Then we can decide if we want to make some changes.

Activity

Read aloud: Let's answer these questions together.

- Do digital devices (phones, tablets, TV) ever keep us from getting enough sleep?
- Do we use them while we eat?
- Do we do activities together without devices?
- Do we ever use them together?
- Does our digital device use ever cause fights? If so, what are the fights about?
- When we use our devices, how is it fun? What do we learn?
- Is there anything we want to change about how we use our devices? If so, what?

Does the way your family uses media feel balanced and healthy? Give a thumbs up or thumbs down. Does your family agree? If you want to make changes, what are they? Think of changes that work for the whole family since you're all on the same team!

Teams are determined by gender, grade level and neighborhood zones. Special requests are NOT GUARANTEED! Kindergarten and 1st grade play at CCC. 2nd grade plays at LRC. Practices may begin in December.

Grade 3-6: REGISTRATION DEADLINE: October 13. More aspects of the game are introduced at each grade level, playing the game with little to no limitations. Basic basketball skills, team play, sportsmanship and fun are the main focus. The season concludes with a playoff for all levels. All players must attend one of the player evaluation days. Players are selected in a draft. Practices may begin in November. Games played on Saturdays at various gyms.

Grades 7 & 8: REGISTRATION DEADLINE: November 3. Northwest Suburban Park District Basketball Conference. We've teamed up with Des Plaines, River Trails, Prospect Heights, Wheeling, Elk Grove, and Northbrook Park Districts to provide a Jr. High basketball league! Games start in January after the Jr. High school season ends. All players must attend one of the player evaluation days. Players are selected in a draft. Teams play a 12 game regular season with a single elimination playoff tournament. Practices may begin in December.
