

Dear Fairview Families,

We have reached the halfway point of our first trimester here at Fairview! Believe it or not, first trimester progress reports are being sent home to parents in the mail over the next few days. Not all students receive a progress report, however, we send them home for students who are showing slow progress in one or more area. If teachers have already reached out to you via phone or email with a progress check, they may not send a formal progress report. Our primary aim is to keep you informed in situations where a student is struggling. I encourage you to reach out to the teacher if your child does receive a progress report to plan together on how to best help them achieve moving forward.

As announced at Back-to-School Night, our Parent Teacher Conferences will take place from 3:45-7:45 p.m. on November 14th, 19th, and 20th. At 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 15th, I will be sending an email out to the parent community with a link to sign up for a conference online using a program called Parent Teacher Conference Fast (PTC Fast). When you click the link, you will be directed to choose your child's teacher(s), enter your child's name, your name, and your email address and click submit. You will then be sent a separate email to sign up for a conference time moments later. Be sure to click submit at the bottom of the page to confirm your time. You will receive a confirmation email when you've completed the process with the time scheduled. If you do not receive it, you likely forgot to click submit. If you need assistance with sign up, please email me at dophus@d57.org or your child's teacher and we can assist you. We will provide detailed instructions on how to sign up in the email that goes out on October 15th as well.

IInstructions

It's important to stay aware of how our on-screen and offscreen activities fit into our lives. Do a media balance checkup on your family. Get one or more family members together to help. Read the setup before doing the activity together!

ಆಳಿ Setup

Read aloud: We balance the food we eat to stay healthy. We also need to balance our media use. Media includes the shows and videos we watch, the video games and apps we play, and the music we listen to. Let's answer questions to see if our media use is balanced. Then we can decide if we want to make some changes.

(<) Activity

Read aloud: Let's answer these questions together.

- Do digital devices (phones, tablets, TV) ever keep us from getting enough sleep?
- Do we use them while we eat?
- Do we do activities together without devices?
- Do we ever use them together?
- Does our digital device use ever cause fights? If so, what are the fights about?
- When we use our devices, how is it fun? What do we learn?
- Is there anything we want to change about how we use our devices? If so, what?

Does the way your family uses media feel balanced and healthy? Give a thumbs up or thumbs down. Does your family agree? If you want to make changes, what are they? Think of changes that work for the whole family since you're all on the same team!






Additional resources and support in developing the binder will also be provided. Our PEPS Parent Ambassadors will be available to help you organize.
