Principal's Message . . .


Dear Lincoln Families,

- * Discounted online registration begins May 1 and runs through June 15
- Access to the online registration portal will be emailed directly to families
- * Parents must have a current email address on file with their school to take part
- Payment methods are credit card or electronic check (no cash accepted), for issues regarding payment method contact the accounting coordinator at (847) 394-7300, extension 1008
- Transportation Any student registering June 15 or after will be assigned to an existing route/stop and will experience delays in routing/bus pass distribution
- Registration process, including payment, must be complete in order for teacher assignment and student schedule to be generated
