

Vehicles behind bus **must** stop. Vehicles traveling in opposite direction, proceed with caution.



# WHAT IS THE DEAL WITH NOT CALLING STUDENTS DOWN TO PICK UP ITEMS PARENTS DROP OFF IN THE OFFICE?

Parents should not expect that the office will interrupt a class to call their child down for dropped-off items. Overall we find that students have already connected with home (usually via text) about forgotten items and they check the front office table throughout the day for that item. The office staff is instructed to keep class-room interruptions to a minimum since there is regular student movement throughout the day. Dropped-off lunches should be placed beneath the office table in the correct grade level lunch bin. These bins are carried down to the lunch room daily. There are, of course, a few exceptions when we will interrupt the classroom. Medical needs, eye glasses, contact lenses, house keys, are a few examples when we will contact your child. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

#### WHAT TIME DOES THE ACTIVITY BUS DEPART?

The activity bus route runs Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday. **Students must be paid bus riders to use this service.** The activity bus usually departs between 3:55 and 4:05 pm. Depending how many students board the bus, the route may take up to an hour to complete its route.

#### Dear Parents:

In the unfortunate event that an emergency or crisis situation occurs in our area during the school day, we want you to know that Lincoln Middle School is prepared. With the help of the Mount Prospect Fire and Police Departments, we have designed a Standardized School Crisis Plan that will assist us in effectively responding to these types of situations.

While your natural instinct as a parent in an emergency is to go to your child's school to safeguard him/her, please understand that doing so may significantly impede our response capabilities as well as those of our local emergency responders. It is vital that school officials and the Police and Fire Departments have access to our buildings to manage the situation and give care to students. In addition, it may be necessary to evacuate students to another location if there is immediate danger.

In an emergency or crisis situation, we need your cooperation and assistance and ask that you please follow the guidelines below:

- In the event of a crisis that requires an evacuation/relocation of students, contact (847) 394-7300 for information. In all other emergency situations, contact (847) 394-7350.
- Tune to major local television and radio stations for information on the situation
  and instructions on how to reunite with your child. In some emergency or crisis
  situations, it may be necessary to relocate to another facility for safety reasons.
   Your designated reunification site is St. Raymond Catholic Church located at
  301 S. I-Oka Avenue.
- When you travel to the reunification site, please be sure to bring picture identification. We will only release students to their legal guardians, or the authorized individuals as listed on your child's emergency forms.

Enclosed you will find quick reference wallet cards with the above information for your use. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter. Our ultimate goal is to keep your children safe while they are under our care.

- <u>School Messenger Phone System:</u> Parents will receive messages via this system when there are school closings or other urgent announcements. Email, the website and social media also will be used in these instances. Be sure to inform your school of any phone or email changes.
- <u>Bus Bulletin</u>: A system that will notify parents via text, email or voice message if their child's bus is delayed. Register online for free.
- <u>School Board:</u> Meetings are generally held at 7 p.m. on the third Thursday of the month at Fairview School. Meeting dates and topics are communicated in advance on the website and social media, and agendas/meeting packets can be found at this <u>link</u>. Community members are welcome to attend Board meetings, and there is time for public comments. Podcasts of the meetings are available at this <u>link</u>. In addition, community members can submit comments/questions for Board members at this <u>link</u>.



## **Cultural Arts**
