CHECK THE BACKPACK!


On Monday, 8th grade students were given a letter to bring home to parents regarding graduation. Today, all students were given their report cards and instructed to bring them home to parents!

Westbrook Kindergarten Enrollment for 2019-20

Students must be 5-years-old by September 1, 2019.

Registering your child for kindergarten includes the following steps:



- I. **Online Pre-Enrollment:** This will begin on <u>January 7</u>. Parents need to complete this step online **before** completing Step 2. Parents provide basic information and schedule a kindergarten screening appointment*. Click <u>here</u> to begin the process, or go to our district website <u>www.d57.org</u> and click on Westbrook School for more enrollment information.
- *Kindergarten Screening: All new kindergarteners complete a brief screening to help inform placement decisions. This year, screenings will be held on Monday April 8 and Monday April 15. Parents will be able to schedule their child's screening appointment online during Step 1.
- 2. **In-Person Enrollment:** This will begin on February 15. Parents must come to Westbrook School between the hours of 8:00 AM-3:00 PM to establish residency. The following documents are required in order to establish residency:
 - 1. The child's original birth certificate
 - 2. Either a copy of a current lease, a monthly mortgage statement, or a current tax bill
 - 3. Two different current utility bills for two consecutive recent months(This is a total of 4 bills)
- 3. **Online Registration:** This is the final step of the enrollment process and occurs online in the spring. After Steps 1 and 2 are complete, parents will receive a link for updating information and paying necessary fees. This includes curricular fees, bus transportation fees, and Kids' Corner Childcare fees.
