Mrs. Smith, our school nurse says . . . Go To Bed!

Is your child getting enough sleep? Children 6-12 years of age need 9-12 hours of sleep each night and children 13-18 years of age need 8-10 hours of sleep.



Not getting enough sleep can contribute to decreased academic success, problems with attention and memory, increased behavior problems, and decreased athletic performance. Sleep is especially important for teens because hormones are released during sleep that help with physical growth. Insufficient sleep also contributes to depression.

Good sleep habits can help your child get a good night's sleep.

Some habits that can improve sleep health:

- Be consistent. Have your child go to bed at the same time each night and get up at the same time each morning, including on the weekends
- Make sure the bedroom is quiet, dark, relaxing, and at a comfortable temperature
- Remove electronic devices, such as TVs, computers, and smart phones from the bedroom
- Avoid large meals and caffeine before bedtime
- Encourage exercise. Being physically active during the day can help with falling asleep more easily at night

The Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) is the new state assessment that replaces PARCC. The IAR will be taken at Lincoln between March 11 and March 21 based on your child's grade. Make-ups will be conducted upon our return from Spring Break.
