## A Message from Mr. Steen

Lincoln has adopted a positive reward system to encourage appropriate student behavior. The positive reward system includes all-school rewards, grade-level rewards, team rewards, class period rewards and individual student rewards. Lincoln's first all-school reward will occur on Thursday, October 31. The reward is that students have the option to "dress up" for Halloween, given a few parameters. The parameters include:

1) No blood or violent themes.

2) No masks or inappropriate props. (Inappropriate props would include weapons, look-alike weapons and any prop that could potentially cause harm to others.)

3) No changing into a costume, applying make-up, painting hair, etc. **while at school**.

4) The regular Lincoln dress code applies. (For example, no exposed midriffs, no exposed undergarments, no revealing shorts/skirts, no inappropriate images, etc.)

5) Any costume deemed by administration to interfere with the operations of school will not be allowed.

"Dressing up" for Halloween doesn't have to mean a traditional costume. Your child may choose to wear orange and/or black or simply choose to wear their favorite sports team's jersey. Please contact Mr. Suminski or me if you have any questions.

## LINCOLN CONFERENCES November 5, 7, 13

Lincoln parents will receive notification of conferences in one of the following ways:

- Personal phone call to arrange a conference
- Email sent home suggesting a conference
- Email sent home explaining a conference is not considered necessary at this time due to our satisfaction with the child's progress or recent communications with parents

# On Monday, October 21, 2019, at 8:00am, the conference sign-up link appeared on the front page of the Lincoln website.

After a team is chosen on the screen, the next screen will display options for available appointments on the conference days. Conferences start at 3:30pm and end at 7:30pm. Once you click on a time, you will fill out a form, and then be sent an email confirmation.

During the time you select, you will have the opportunity to meet with your child's core teachers (Language Arts, Social Studies, Science, and Math). Teachers are seated within the same room (room assignments will be determined closer to conferences and posted at school on the day of conferences) and parents will have the opportunity to meet with teachers individually for several minutes. The other teachers your child sees (music program, broad experience, physical education, foreign language) will all be present on conference days as well and are available on a drop-in basis.

# First Quarter Ends !

- TODAY, Friday, October 25 is the last day of the first quarter and most students will have a change of schedule (CSO class or Broad Experience) on Monday, October 28. Check the Parent Portal to confirm your change of class.
- Lincoln's health education classes will begin in PE classes during the 2nd quarter.
   Lessons incorporate the Illinois health Standards, i.e., coping with stress;
   understanding emotions; and changes during the teen years. The health grade is included in the PE grade on the portal but will have separate health categories. The two grades are averaged as one grade on the portal and for the report card.
- On Friday, November 1, eport cards, MAP scores, IAR scores will be distributed to students at the end of the day. 6th grade students will also get Illinois Science Assessment results. Students will be directed to bring these items home to their parents or guardians.

### Help us keep our school healthy:

PLEASE DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL for 24 hours if they have had a fever over 100 degrees, or an episode of vomiting or diarrhea. Your child may be feeling better, but they are still contagious and can expose other children and staff to their illness. Do not give your child a medication to treat the fever and send them to school. The medicine may cause the child's temperature to be normal, but the child is still contagious with the illness that caused the fever.

#### Tis the Season:

During most flu seasons, which typically run from October through May, between 10 percent and 20 percent of the population is infected with influenza viruses. More than 200,000 people are hospitalized from flu complications each year in the U.S. According to the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), most people who get the flu recover completely in 1 to 2 weeks, but some people develop serious and potentially life-threatening medical complications. Talk to your doctor about getting a flu shot.

Teams are determined by gender, grade level and neighborhood zones. Special requests are NOT GUARANTEED! Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade play at CCC. 2<sup>nd</sup> grade plays at LRC. Practices may begin in December.

**Grade 3-6:** REGISTRATION DEADLINE: October 13. More aspects of the game are introduced at each grade level, playing the game with little to no limitations. Basic basketball skills, team play, sportsmanship and fun are the main focus. The season concludes with a playoff for all levels. All players must attend one of the player evaluation days. Players are selected in a draft. Practices may begin in November. Games played on Saturdays at various gyms.

**Grades 7 & 8:** REGISTRATION DEADLINE: November 3. Northwest Suburban Park District Basketball Conference. We've teamed up with Des Plaines, River Trails, Prospect Heights, Wheeling, Elk Grove, and Northbrook Park Districts to provide a Jr. High basketball league! Games start in January after the Jr. High school season ends. All players must attend one of the player evaluation days. Players are selected in a draft. Teams play a 12 game regular season with a single elimination playoff tournament. Practices may begin in December.
