### Principal's Message . . .

Dear Lincoln Families.

Several weeks ago, our August 24th newsletter included information about the Mount Prospect Safe School Emergency Guidelines. If you haven't already, please be sure to set aside a few moments to review that information. Lincoln Middle School continues to strive to provide a safe and secure environment for its students and staff.

Further, I want to share the following with Lincoln families:

- Fire, tornado (shelter-in-place), and lock down drills were practiced successfully on the first day of school.
- All school entrances are locked during the school day. Visitors are only allowed access through Door #1 (front office) and must be "buzzed" in by office personnel. Please do not be offended if your identity or purpose is questioned to determine admittance.
- School offices are equipped with emergency weather and police radios.
- We maintain an active and involved partnership with the Mount Prospect Police and Fire Departments.
- Crossing guards and bus monitors are present at the start and end of the school day.
- Lunch supervisors are outside at lunch recess for each grade level.

Effective school safety procedures require the commitment of all parties—students, parents, and school staff. Your support is vital in our efforts to provide a prepared and safe environment at Lincoln Middle School.

## Lincoln Chromebook Q and A

### Charging:

- Q. Are Chromebooks to be fully charged at the beginning of the school day?
- A. Yes.
- **Q**. Is the charge cord to be left at home?
- A. Yes.
- **Q**. Is there the ability to charge at school?
- A. Technically, but there are only 20 charging slots and over 750 students with Chromebooks. It is expected that the Chromebook will be charged at home. Charging chromebooks at school should be a last resort. The charging station, located in the front office, is not in place of responsibly charging the Chromebook at home each night. Using the charging station disrupts the students ability to participate in class while the Chromebook is charging and also disrupts the front office staff.

### Loaners:

- Q. Are loaner Chromebooks available when a student's Chromebook is out for repair?
- A. Yes. BUT the loaners are first used for those students with a Chromebook hardware issue and not a misuse issue. There are a limited number of loaners available.
- **Q**. Are the loaner Chromebooks available for students who forget theirs at home or have an uncharged Chromebook?
- A. No. Loaners are only used for Chromebooks that are in need of repair. There are a limited number of loaners available.

### Chromebook and Case Handling:

- Q. Should anything besides the Chromebook be put inside the secure case?
- A. No!! Even small headphones should not be left or placed in the Chrome-book case. This has caused cracked screens.
- Q. Should the Chromebook be put inside a backpack or other bag?
- A. No. This can easily cause a cracked screen.
- Q. Should the Chromebook be taken out of the secure case?
- A. No. This can also cause a cracked screen or other damage to the Chromebook.

  The Chromebook should always stay in the case.
- Q. Can I decorate the Chromebook with stickers or anything else?
- **A**. No. Do not put any stickers on the Chromebook and do not remove any of the stickers or labels already on the Chromebook. Do not write or mark on the Chromebook.

### **ASK THE OFFICE LADIES...**

**Question:** How come the office will not deliver an item to my child when I drop it off?

### Answer:

The school office gets dozens of items dropped off every day and the front office staff is expected to keep classroom interruptions to a minimum. Often, students have contacted home, usually via text, and are aware that the items is being dropped off.

Students are instructed to check the office table in between passing periods for any items they might expect from home. More often than not, parents and students have communicated and the items are picked up quickly.

Eyeglasses, contacts, etc., will be delivered as soon as possible.



Dropping off a lunch?

Label it with your child's name and grade then drop it in the grade-level lunch bin in the office. Lunches will be brought down at the appropriate lunch period.

Please note: Fast food (i.e., Jimmy Johns) should not be ordered for delivery as a student lunch. We can not manage fast food deliveries in the school office. Parents may drop off fast food items, label the lunch, and place the items in the lunch bin. Fountain drinks will not be delivered to the cafeteria.

Parents may not bring items such as pizzas or birthday cakes for students to share during their lunch period.

### LINCOLN HOMEWORK REQUEST GUIDELINES





### Homework request AFTER an absence:

- A homework request can be initiated after students have missed at least two days of school. Teachers are not required to provide homework before the two-day minimum.
- If parents and students are interested in obtaining homework prior to the two-day minimum, then they are encouraged to check team webpages on the Lincoln website.
- Upon returning to school, students must turn in homework that was given to them before the absence. Students, however, will have <u>one day for</u> <u>each day of absence</u> to make-up any work that was not given to them before the absence.
- Students are responsible upon their return to check with all of their teachers for any homework, tests, quizzes, projects, or other assignments that need to be made up.

### **Homework request BEFORE an absence:**

- A homework request before an absence should be initiated by contacting a teacher at least three days prior to the absence.
- Teachers are not required to provide homework before an absence. If a teacher does provide homework, please be aware that the homework is the teacher's "best estimate." There may be changes in the homework upon the student's return and/or an alternate assignment may be given.
- Parents and students are encouraged to check team webpages on the <u>Lincoln website</u> for homework.
- Upon returning to school, students will have <u>one</u>
   <u>day for each day of absence</u> to make-up any work
   that was given to them before the absence.

### **Lincoln Middle School PTO of Mount Prospect Committees**

<u>Cultural Arts</u> plans assemblies and programs for the students which complement the school curriculum.

**Dynamite Night** is an annual fall event of games, prizes, food, music and dancing. Sixth graders attend in the late afternoon and seventh/eighth graders in the evening. This committee hires the game vendor and DJ, purchases food and schedules volunteers. This is the biggest social event sponsored by the Lincoln PTO.

<u>Eighth Grade Activities</u> are end of year events for the eighth graders that include a dance, picnic, baby picture contest, and production of a video. It's a great way to send off our eighth graders and provide wonderful memories to take with them to high school.

<u>Grade level activities</u> are held for sixth (typically considered to be Dynamite Night) and seventh grade students. This committee plans the events, orders food (if needed), secures raffle prizes and schedules volunteers.

<u>Staff Appreciation</u> plans activities to recognize Lincoln's staff. This includes providing meals during conferences and during staff appreciation week in May. The committee determines theme, events and coordinates activities and volunteers.

<u>Winter Activities</u> plans for a ski/sledding trip at a local facility during the winter months. The committee collects registration forms, money, secures transportation and orders snacks. (And snow!)

### **2018 POSTER CONTEST**

### "Look. Listen. Learn. Be aware. Fire can happen anywhere."

Mount Prospect students are encouraged to design a poster using this year's theme. Students may enter the contest through their school or individually if their school elects not to participate. ### Entries are judged on originality, creativity and use of theme.

All entries will receive a participation ribbon; however, a first, second and third place winner will be chosen from each grade level. ### **CONTEST RULES:**

Kindergarten through 5th grade students are invited to design a poster.

All submittals must contain the following information (on the back of their submittal):

- 1. Student's Full Name
- 2. Student's Home Phone Number
- 3. Name of School
- 4. Grade Level
- 5. Teacher's Name
- All posters must be completed on poster board (maximum size of 16" x 20").
- Individual entries can be dropped off at the Police/Fire Headquarters, 112 E. Northwest Hwy. (Fire Department Second Floor), or at the main office of the student's school prior to the deadline.
- The deadline for entries is October 10, 2018.
- All entries will be returned to the students' schools after the contest ends.
