Hello Lincoln Families!


Please check the backpack:

FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Attendance is critical to your child's success in school. While some absences are not avoidable (students should stay home from school for 24 hours after an episode of fever over 100 degrees, vomiting or diarrhea), a student is considered chronically absent if they miss only **two days of school per month**, whether the absences are excused or unexcused. Research shows that even one year of chronic

absences can cause a child to fall behind academically and decrease a child's chances of graduating from high school, which can have long-term consequences on their financial independence, physical well-being and mental health.


If your child is missing school on a frequent basis, talk to your child's teachers or the school nurse about how to support more consistent attendance.



PSAT 8/9 testing will take place from 8:00 am - 12:00 pm at all six high schools in District 214 on Saturday, October 26 and the make-up test date will be Saturday, November 2, 2019. ASK THE OFFICE LADIES...

Question:

Where is my child's lunch bag, it never makes it home?

Answer: If your child is missing his or her lunch bag, be sure to remind him or her to check the cafeteria or the Lincoln Lost and Found. Lunch bags, unfortunately, can not remain in the Lost and Found cubbies for too long. Because of food debris left in lunch bags, we have to dispose of unclaimed lunch bags in about a week's time. Look for your lunch bag right away. Parents are welcome to check the Lost and Found as well. PUT YOUR NAME ON YOUR LUNCH BAG and it stands a much better chance of being returned to you.

Question:

Speaking of Lost and Found, what do you do with all that stuff?

Answer: Our Lost and Found will be overflowing by the end of each quarter. In the week or so following the close of a quarter, items in the Lost and Found are donated to charity. Every effort is made to return those items labelled with a student name. Announcements are made to remind students that items in the Lost and Found will be donated to charity. Reminders are also included in the parent newsletter.

Question:

How come the office will not deliver an item to my child when I drop it off?

Answer:

The school office gets dozens of items dropped off every day and the front office staff is expected to keep classroom interruptions to a minimum. Often, students have contacted home, usually via text, and are aware that the item is being dropped off.

Students are instructed to check the office table in between passing periods for any items they might expect from home. More often than not, parents and students have communicated and the items are picked up quickly.

Eyeglasses, contacts, etc., will be delivered as soon as possible.

Dropping off a lunch?

Label it with your child's name and grade then drop it in the grade-level lunch bin in the office. Lunches will be brought down at the appropriate lunch period.

Please note: Fast food (i.e., Jimmy Johns) should not be ordered for delivery as a student lunch. We can not manage fast food deliveries in the school office. Parents may drop off fast food items, label the lunch, and place the items in the lunch bin. Fountain drinks will not be delivered to the cafeteria.

Parents may not bring items such as pizzas or birthday cakes for students to share during their lunch period.

Cultural Arts

Plans assemblies and programs for students which complement the school curriculum

Dynamite Night

This is an annual event of games, prizes, food, music, and dancing. Sixth graders attend in the late afternoon and seventh/eighth graders in the evening. This committee hires the game vendor and DJ, purchases food and schedules volunteers. This is the biggest school event sponsored by the Lincoln PTO.

Eighth Grade Activities

These are end of the year events for the eighth graders including a dance, picnic, baby picture contest, and production of a video. It's a great way to send off our eighth graders and provide wonderful memories to take with them to high school.

Seventh Grade Activity

This activity is an off campus event. In recent years the seventh graders have enjoyed an evening of YMCA fun, roller skating, and the trampoline park. This committee plans the event, orders food (if necessary) and schedules volunteers.

Staff Appreciation

This committee plans activities to recognize Lincoln's Staff. This includes providing meals during fall conferences and during staff appreciation week in May. The committee determines theme, events, food, raffle prizes, other activities and coordinates the volunteers.

Winter Activity

This committee plans for a ski/sledding trip at a local facility during the winter months. This open to all grade levels. The committee collects registration forms, money, secures transportation, and orders snacks/food (if needed).
