From the Principal ...

Dear Westbrook Families,

Our staff kicked off our professional book study during our staff meeting. We are reading the book Conscious Discipline written by Dr. Becky Bailey. Dr. Bailey is a leader in brain-based social-emotional learning. This book builds off of last year's professional book study of The Whole-Brain Child: 12 Revolutionary Strategies to Nurture Your Child's Developing Minds written by Dr. Daniel Siegel and Dr. Tina Bryson, which explains how a child's brain is wired and how it matures. Everyday experiences, including the books we read, the activities we participate in, the discussions we have, and the time we spend with family and friends, help to mold our brains. Both of these books offer different skills and strategies to help foster healthy brain development and emotional intelligence.

Safety Drills This morning, we practiced what to do in the case of severe weather. The students did an excellent job of staying quiet and listening to their teachers. We will complete another drill this afternoon to make sure that all of our students know what to do in the case of an emergency.

Next week, our kindergarteners and first graders will learn how to stay safe while riding a bus and what to do if there is an emergency on the bus during our bus evacuation drills.



We work with students* in kindergarten and first grade who speak a language other than English and/or live in a home where a language other than English is spoken. Let us introduce ourselves:

Our primary roles as EL teachers are to develop students' English language proficiency and support students' grade-level content learning. We also collaborate with classroom teachers in meeting ELs' needs. Services we provide:

- Push In Support Service: Focuses on assisting students in the mainstream classroom especially during writing times
- Pull Out Support Service: Focuses on social and academic English language development in listening, speaking, reading, and writing

With the start of the new school year, we are always excited to see the diversity among our student population at Westbrook! This year, Westbrook's students and/or their families speak 28 different languages! Aside from English, Polish remains the most spoken native language. 



Math Support Services (MSS)

I hope everyone is having a great start to the school year! For those of you that are not familiar with the Math Support Services (MSS) program, it is a program that allows students to receive additional math support in order to reinforce classroom concepts. Throughout the year we will be covering different topics found in the *Math in Focus* curriculum, which is the curriculum that is used in all of the classrooms.

Math in Focus is an authentic Singapore math curriculum that uses problem solving as the center of learning. Concepts are first introduced with real-world, hands-on experiences. Then they are visualized and represented through a picture. Finally, numbers and symbols are used to demonstrate understanding.



Students learn to solve complex mathematical problems by gaining the knowledge, content, and skills needed to succeed. The curriculum encourages positive student interaction with mathematics, which results in students developing a better ability to solve complex, real-world math problems. Singapore Math is elementary mathematics taught in a "powerful and potent way."

Here is some additional information to get better acquainted with Singapore Math and why it is beneficial to students:

- Singapore Math focuses on mastery, not just learning for a test
 - The curriculum generally focuses on fewer topics but in greater depth. Students don't just learn equations to reach an answer; they learn how the equation works.
- Visual and audible learners thrive
 - Learning math begins with the concrete: blocks, cards, buttons, etc. Then there are abstract equations 2 + 3 = 5. But Singapore Math introduces the "pictorial" phase a bridge between concrete and abstract.
