Dear Westbrook Families,

I hope this message finds you all enjoying these beautiful September days we've been having!

Fall Conferences Westbrook will hold parent-teacher conferences on **Tuesday**, **November 12**, **Thursday**, **November 14**, **and Tuesday**, **November 19** from 4:20-8:20pm. We will be using an online conference scheduling system. **Conference sign-ups will open on October 2nd at 8pm and close on November 1st at 10am.** Please mark this date on your calendar, so that you can sign up with a time to meet with your child's teacher to discuss your child's progress at a time that would work with your family's schedule.

Data Days Along with teacher observations, parent feedback, students' daily classroom work, and benchmark assessments are used to inform teachers' instruction to meet students' individual learning needs. Next week, our kindergarten team and first grade team will meet to review the assessment data that we have about our students' early literacy and math skills. Teams will use the data to identify ways that instruction can be refined to support student growth in the areas of literacy and math. Teams will also identify students who would benefit from additional support from our Literacy Support Services (LSS) and Math Support Services (MSS) teams. Families whose children are identified as benefiting from additional support in one or both of these areas will receive letters indicating that they will receive math or literacy support. Please reach out to your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions.

Walk for Westbrook Our PTO has worked hard to plan for the Walk for Westbrook this year. This event is the only fundraiser that our PTO sponsors to support all of the wonderful programs they plan and provide for our students throughout the school year. During LRC, students have been learning about different landmarks around the world, which fits with the theme of our Walk, *Walk Around the World*, for this year! During the Walk on October 3rd, students will walk around the school and interact with themed stations with landmarks from around the world.

Tasty Bites The Westbrook PTO will be sponsoring the Tasty Bites Program again this year! This is a special opportunity for kindergarten and 1st grade students to sample a fresh fruit and/or vegetable each month during one of their PE classes. The Tasty Bites program is always a huge hit among the students!

We also reviewed our Westbrook expectations of being safe, kind, and ready on the bus. Next week, we will practice our lockdown drills. For all of our drills, we work closely with the Mount Prospect Fire Department and Mount Prospect Police Department.

Supporting Fine Motor Skills Development at Home

Parents often want to know if their children are progressing appropriately in terms of fine motor skills, and how they can help at home. Here are some developmental expectations and activities to have your children practice.

Age/grade	Visual Motor Skill
3-4/Preschool	-Can copy lines, circles, and a cross. -Can draw a person with head, face, torso, and limbs with demonstration -Can cut on or near a 5" bolded line
4-5/Preschool	-Can imitate a square (may need step-by-step demonstration) -Can cut on or near a curve, and simple shapes
Early Kindergarten	-Can imitate an X and a triangle after watching adult demonstrate -Can copy letters of first name (in upper case is acceptable)
Late Kindergarten/ Early 1st grade	-Can copy most of upper case and lower case alphabet -Can legibly copy a few words (and for some, a sentence**) -Reversals of letters and numbers in writing are common at this age, and often until late second grade

**It is important to remember that children's written legibility is dependent on their academic writing ability. Children who are just learning to spell and put thoughts down on paper will struggle with legibility at first.

Home activities to help prepare kids for fine motor activities include:

- Manipulating playdoh or clay is great for building the muscles of the hand and fingers
- Legos are great for finger strengthening
- Playing with Squigz--they suction to table top and glass surfaces, and require force to pull them off
- Coloring with crayons or colored pencils is a great way to build hand and finger strength, control of the hand, and visual perceptual skills by staying in the lines
- Using tweezers or other items that require squeezing with the fingers is a great activity to promote scissors usage
- Cutting playdoh--this is especially great for reluctant cutters because it's a fun, engaging activity
- Provide your child construction paper, scissors and glue. Kids love to just cut out pieces from different colored paper, and glue them together on another piece of paper to make abstract art!
- Sidewalk chalk (weather permitting, of course). Kids love drawing outside!

Mount Prospect students are encouraged to design a poster using this year's theme. Students may enter the contest through their school or individually if their school elects not to participate. Entries are judged on originality, creativity and use of theme.

All entries will receive a participation ribbon; however, a first, second and third place winner will be chosen from each grade level. CONTEST RULES:

Kindergarten through 5th grade students are invited to design a poster.

All submittals must contain the following information (on the back of their submittal):

- 1. Student's Full Name
- 2. Student's Home Phone Number
- 3. Name of School
- 4. Grade Level
- 5. Teacher's Name
- All posters must be completed on poster board (maximum size of 16" x 20").
- Individual entries can be dropped off at the Police/Fire Headquarters, 112 E. Northwest Hwy. (Fire Department Second Floor), or at the main office of the student's school prior to the deadline.
- The deadline for entries is October 9, 2019.
- All entries will be returned to the students' schools after the contest ends.
