Dear Westbrook Families,

I hope this message finds you all enjoying these beautiful September days we've been having!

Fall Conferences Westbrook will hold parent-teacher conferences on Thursday, November 8,

Data Days Along with teacher observations, parent feedback, students' daily classroom work, and

benchmark assessments are used to inform teachers' instruction to meet students' individual learning needs. This week, our kindergarten team and first grade team met to review the assessment data that we have about our students' early literacy and math skills. Teams used the data to identify ways that instruction can be refined to support student growth in the areas of literacy and math. Teams also identified students who would benefit from additional support from our Literacy Support Services (LSS) and Math Support Services (MSS) teams. Families whose children were identified as benefiting from additional support in one or both of these areas will receive letters next week. Please reach out to your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions.



Safety Concerns

For the safety of the students and staff, please do not bring your pet when dropping off or picking up your child. Even the friendliest of pets will protect their owner if they feel they are in danger, many young children are afraid of them, and students may be affected by allergies. The presence of an animal can create an uncomfortable situation for parents and staff. Thank you for your cooperation.

We request that you discontinue all cell phone calls when you are dropping off or picking up your child. Your undivided attention will contribute to the safety of children and staff.

When waiting at Door 9 for your student to be dismissed, please do not allow anyone to climb on the wall/fence. We would not want anyone to get hurt.

Building Access

All visitors and volunteers **<u>must</u>** enter the building through the office entrance (Door 1) during the school day. All visitors must sign in at the office and wear a visitor's badge while in the school building.

Please be advised that no parent/guardian is allowed to take their child off of the playground during school hours. Please follow school policy—come to the office, sign the child out, and let the office staff locate the student.

Also, if you plan to go to our playground after AM dismissal, please stop by the office for a visitor tag so that our recess supervisors are aware of approved visitors.

Bus Tags

If your student is a bus rider, please make sure you attach the bus tag provided by the District Business office to the handle on top of your child's backpack. This tag is required to ride the buses. If you did not receive a tag, please contact the office. Thanks!

1st Grade Snacks

Please make sure <u>not</u> to pack your 1st grader's snack in their lunchboxes. Students may not have access to their lunchboxes during the day. Retrieving snacks from lunchboxes at a different location is a big distraction in their day. Thanks for your help with this.

Absences/Notes to School

If your child will be absent from school, please contact us at (847) 394-7340, Option 1, to report the absence. Also, if there will be any changes in your child's daily routine, please send a note to your teacher so that she is informed. The note will then be forwarded to the office.

Literacy Support Services

Welcome back returning families and welcome new Westbrook families! LSS, which stands for <u>L</u>iteracy <u>S</u>upport <u>S</u>ervices, provides students with an extra dose of literacy

instruction in addition to classroom learning and is an extension of the skills and strategies students are working on in their kindergarten or 1st grade classroom. Throughout the year we will be covering topics such as phonemic awareness, phonics, reading strategies, comprehension, fluency and vocabulary. Each month we will be sharing helpful tips, strategies and activities in the Friday newsletter that you can do at home to help your child grow as a reader. 

<u>Physical Therapy Bite</u>

Physical Activity and Academic Performance: Focus on Bilateral Coordination



We all know the benefit of physical activity on our bodies. Besides the cardiovascular and musculoskeletal benefits, did you know that physical activity has positive benefits on the brain, especially for our growing students?

Here are just a few of them:

- 1. Improved cognitive skills, including attention, memory and verbal comprehension.
- 2. Improved academic achievement on test scores
- 3. Attitude changes in motivation and self concept

4. Improved academic behaviors such as on task behaviors, organization, motor planning and impulse control. (Reference: Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Atlanta, GA)

Besides movement and activity in school, it is recommended for school age children to get at least one hour of physical activity per day outside from school.

One way to stay physically active, is to practice bilateral coordination skills...

What is Bilateral Coordination?

Bilateral coordination is defined as the ability to coordinate both sides of the body at the same time in a controlled and organized manner, such as crawling, climbing stairs, riding a bike, throwing a ball and tying shoes. To complete tasks like this, both sides of the brain have to communicate, there has to be an ability to reach across the body and there has to be a sense of spatial awareness- where one's body is in space. This explains why children get more refined and "coordinated " as they get older and as a skill is being practiced.

If the aforementioned components are missing or are difficult, a child might appear as "clumsy" or might be fearful or cautious.

What is the relationship to Academic Performance?

<u>Pediatrics International</u> has reported a significant association between interlimb (bilateral) coordination and academic performance in a group of 100 8-11 year olds. The higher the scores on the motor test (particularly in the area of bilateral coordination), the higher their academic achievement. For the full article, please access this reference:


